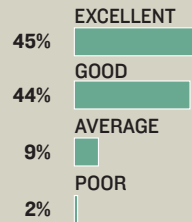

Is your agency making progress on systems accreditation and certification, as required by the Federal Information Systems Security Act?



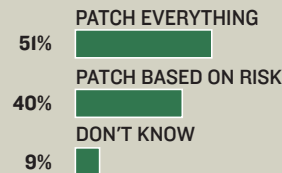

Is patch management an integrated component of your agency's security program?



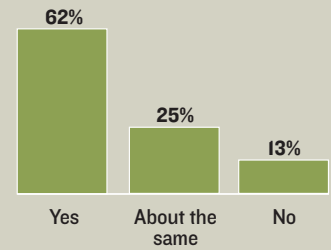
Do you patch based on risk or do you patch everything you can?



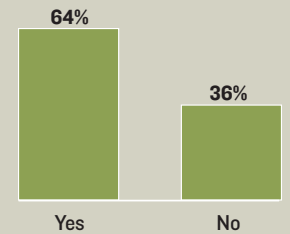

Is your agency doing more IT outsourcing today than two years ago?

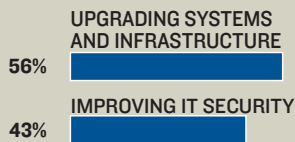


Do you believe that outsourcing has been generally beneficial to government agencies?

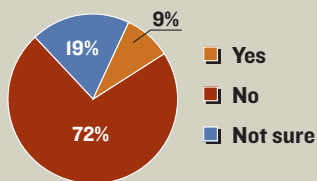

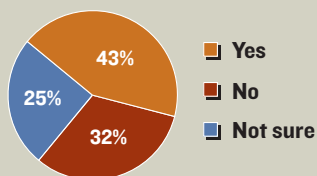

Do you think progress is being made on sorting out and reducing the number of legacy applications?

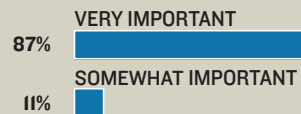

How important will it be to have Web services deployed across government systems in the next three to five years?



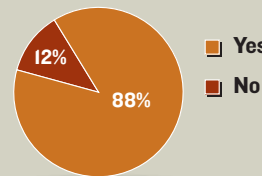
Have Web services technologies been implemented at your agency?



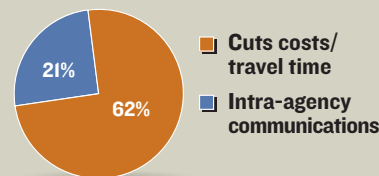

Do you use videoconferencing at your agency?



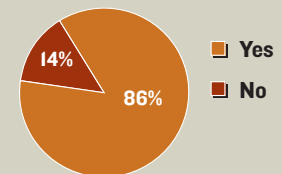

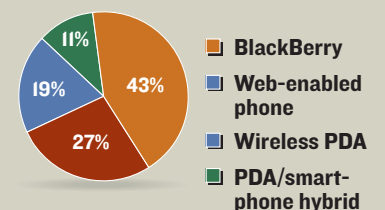
