WHO RUNS MILLENNIA AND MILLENNIA LITE:

General Services Administration

ESTABLISHED:

GSA awarded Millennium in 1999, Lite in 2000. Millennium expires in April 2009, while Lite will expire in 2010.

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SERVICES, MILLENNIA

Millennia is designed for "total solution" IT services—that is, the broad scope of IT services, including new and emerging technologies—under three functional

areas: software engineering, communications and systems integration.

SERVICES, MILLENNIA LITE

Lite is designed for a system's technology lifecycle. The scope of services cover four functional areas: 1) high-end IT; 2) IT planning, assessments and studies; 3) legacy systems migration and enterprise systems development; and 4) mission support services.

FEES

GSA charges a contract access fee of 0.75 percent. If FEDSIM's assisted services are used, CAF is capped at \$25,000 for Millennium. FEDSIM's service fee is additional, which varies from a \$300,000 fixed price for Millennium to an hourly rate for Millennium Lite.

HOW TO ORDER:

A customer agency can directly award task orders upon receiving proper delegation of contracting authority from GSA.

A client agency can use FEDSIM's assisted services to award task orders.

There is no ceiling for task orders; however, the Millennium GWAC has a total capacity ceiling of \$25 billion and Millennium Lite has a contract ceiling of \$20 billion.

WHAT OTHER GWACS OR MACS COMPETE?

Millennia does not compete against other GWACs, internal or external; it complements other GWACs, GSA says. Millennium is specifically designed for large, complex IT programs and projects that other GWACs are not well-suited to handle.

On a limited scale, two pending IDIQ multiple-award contracts—the Homeland Security Department's Eagle and the Army's Total Engineering and Integration Services 2, when they are actually awarded—would compete for some of the same IT business.

Millennia Lite competes with other GWACs and multiple-award contracts including, but not limited to, the Army's Total Engineering and Integration Services 2, the Commerce Department's CommITS NextGen and GSA's own IT schedule.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR MILLENNIA AND MILLENNIA LITE?

GSA is merging the contracts into the new Alliant GWAC, which will be awarded in 2007.
