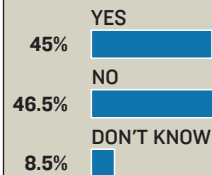


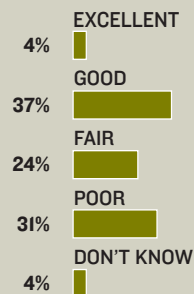
### Divided on agency gains

Do you think agencies are meeting the PMA's goal of improving government performance and results?



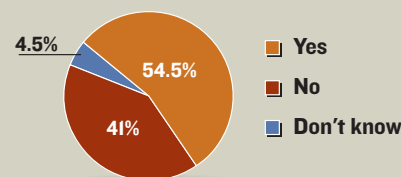
### Making headway?

How would you characterize overall government progress on the PMA?



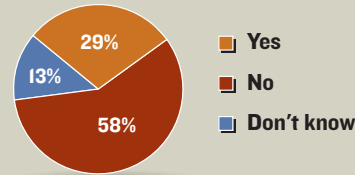
### Aiming for results

Does the use of the three-color scorecard offer agencies adequate feedback on how they should improve overall management?

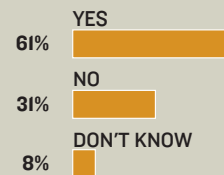

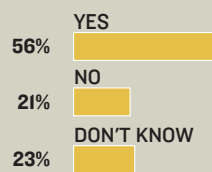
### Progress on performance

Is your agency making use of performance measures as mandated under the PMA?



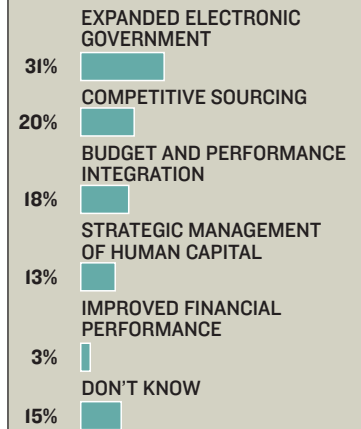
### More performance contracts

Has your agency made an effort to increase the use of performance-based contracting techniques?



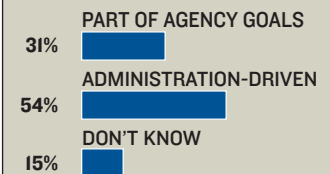
### E-gov advances
